Calvert County Government Announces Local Guidance in Accordance with Stage Two Recovery

PRINCE FREDERICK, Md. – June 12, 2020 – The Calvert County Board of County Commissioners announces that Calvert County will take parallel actions following Gov. Larry Hogan’s announcement to include expanded services for indoor dining and outdoor amusements, beginning Friday, June 12, 2020, at 5 p.m., under Stage Two of the Maryland “Roadmap to Recovery.”

Outdoor Pools: The Department of Parks & Recreation announces that Kings Landing Park and Cove Point Park pools will reopen for lap swim only beginning Monday, June 15. Kings Landing pool will be open 6-7 a.m. and noon to 7 p.m. Cove Point Park pool will be open 10:30 a.m. to 7 p.m.

Access is limited to Calvert County residents only and pool time will be limited to one hour. To prevent lines and wait times, swimmers must reserve a swim time through the WebTrac

online registration system at <https://webtrac.co.cal.md.us/wbwsc/webtrac.wsc/splash.html>. Walk-ins will not be admitted.

Swimmers must maintain adequate physical distancing at all times and must wear a mask when not in the water.

Parks & Recreation staff continues to work with the Calvert County Health Department on reopening strategies for open swim, swim programs and additional facilities. Further information will be provided at a later date. For questions, please contact the Department of Parks & Recreation at 410-535-2600, ext. 2649.

Indoor Dining: Calvert County restaurants that added temporary outdoor seating during Stage One and that intend to maintain this option during the state's reopening phases must work with the Calvert County Department of Planning & Zoning and the Calvert County Health Department to ensure adherence to reopening requirements.

The combination of reduced indoor seating and temporary outdoor seating may not exceed the approved occupancy of the establishment.

In addition, dine-in establishments must ensure:

- Adequate physical distancing between tables
- High contact surfaces are disinfected after each use
- Face coverings are worn by staff interacting with the public and each other (if less than 6 feet apart in the kitchen)
- Restrooms are provided for dine-in locations
- Large groups are minimized
- Health survey forms are provided for staff to complete prior to returning to work
- Use of disposable menus, condiments and flatware
- Adequate training is provided to staff
