PRINCE FREDERICK, Md. – Jan. 31, 2017 – On behalf of the Calvert County Planning Commission, the Department of Community Planning and Building (CPB) will hold the third round of public meetings aimed at updating the county's Comprehensive Plan. Five workshops will be held in February, March and April, each focused on a different key issue.

Citizens are encouraged to attend the workshops and take an active role in this process. All workshops will be held from 7-8:30 p.m. at the College of Southern Maryland, Prince Frederick Campus, located at 115 J.W. Williams Road.
