## USING FAMILY LAW ASSISTANCE SERVICES

The Family Services Office of the Circuit Court for Calvert County offers a free clinic for those in need of legal advice and assistance with Family Law issues.

The ***Family Law Assistance Clinic*** provides the opportunity for you to speak with an attorney free of charge in a brief consultation. This consultation is not an agreement for legal representation.

### Things to Remember:

This is a first come, first served program. Bring all paperwork about your case.

It is best to leave small children at home. No child care is available.

## WHAT THE ATTORNEY WILL DO

Offer assistance and advice on how to represent yourself in family law cases.

Answer questions about the legal process for family law cases.

Assist in completing relevant forms and papers for filing with the court for family law cases.

Answer specific questions about ongoing family law cases for those who do not have an attorney.

## WHEN THIS SERVICE IS OFFERED

The clinic is offered every Wednesday from 12:30 p.m. to 2:30 p.m. On the day of the clinic, you must complete a brief intake at the Family Services Office on the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor of the Circuit Courthouse. You will be given a number and called in number order when the clinic begins. Intake begins at 8:30 a.m. on Wednesdays.
